## The Open Champions

To create our new wine list, we opened more than 50 different bottles. Only 14 made the cut. Introducing our Opened Champions.

### WHITE OPENED CHAMPIONS

**Bodegas Penafiel Alba de Miros Verdejo £18 (bottle) / £5.50 (glass)**

Rueda, Spain: 2011: 100% Verdejo: 13% vol

A fresh vibrant gem from Ribera del Duero, full of apple and pear fruit.

Crisp acidity and soft body for deliciously ripe flavour. A superb 'all-rounder'.

**Picpoul de Pinet Domaine de La Mirande £19.50 (bottle) / £6 (glass)**

Languedoc, France: 2011: 100% Piquepoul: 13% vol

Picpoul is the new Pinot Grigio. Gentle, soft and very easy drinking.

Crisp, citrus and floral before revealing soft acidity, touches of melon, and the lightness of a feather.

**Momo Sauvignon Blanc £22 (bottle)**

Marlborough, New Zealand: 2011: 100% Sauvignon Blanc: 13.5% vol

A second wine from Seresin Estate, one of the very best Marlborough producers. Zesty notes of grapefruit and freshly cut grass for something soft, balanced and silky smooth, with lovely concentration.

**Albariño Abadía de San Campio, Bodegas Terras Gauda £26 (bottle)**

Rias Baixas, Spain: 2011: 100% Albariño: 13% vol

A fuller wine with incredible flavour. Bright citrus, pineapple, mandarin flavours that leave you with a lovely velvety complexity. Great on its own, even better with food.

**Sancerre La Vigne Blanche Maison Henri Bourgeois £29 (bottle)**

Sancerre, France: 2011: 100% Sauvignon Blanc: 13% vol

The Sancerre of the Bourgeois family has long been hailed by the critics as one of the finest in the land.

Vinous with herbaceous notes of elderflower and kiwifruit. Deliciously ripe, perfumed and crisp.

### RED OPENED CHAMPIONS

**Domaine Vintur AOC Ventoux £18 (bottle) / £5.50 (glass)**

Rhone, France: 2011: Grenache, Syrah: 14.5%

A classic Southern Rhône blend of Grenache and Syrah. This great all-rounder has aromas of red fruit and hints of plummy fruit and soured cherries. Well-balanced flavour with supple tannins and dry fruits with a hint of spice.

**Mas Montel Petit Syrah, Vin de Pays de Garde £19.50 (bottle) / £6 (glass)**

South of France: 2010: 100% Petit Syrah: 12.5% vol

An up and coming domaine near Montpellier whose wines are all about easy drinking and exceptional value.

Here notes of red fruits, spice and leather give way to soft, velvety aromas of wild blackberry.

**Fincas de Landaluce Crianza, Rioja Alavesa £24 (bottle)**

Rioja, Spain: 2009: 100% Tempranillo: 14.5% vol

A critically acclaimed Rioja from a winemaker who keeps production low and quality high.

Juicy, ripe red fruits of cherry and vanilla for round and complex flavour with silky tannin and great balance.

**Sesti Monteleccio £26 (bottle)**

Tuscany, Italy: 2010: 100% Sangiovese: 14%

This delightful 100% Sangiovese is wonderfully fragrant and attractive with a lovely bouquet of sweet blueberry and strawberry fruit and soft florals. The palate is elegant and pure with a smooth, vibrant texture laced with raspberries and summer fruits.

**Momo Pinot Noir £27 (bottle)**

Marlborough, New Zealand: 2010: 100% Pinot Noir: 14% vol

What can match Momo's Sauvignon Blanc? Its Pinot Noir: light, elegant and silky. Start with aromas of black cherry, mocha, new leather and hints of spice. Finish with succulent red fruits layered over smoky oak and fine mouth coating tannins.

**Domaine Georges Vernay, Saint-Agathe, Syrah £29.50 (bottle)**

Rhone, France: 2011: 100% Syrah: 14.5% vol

Georges Vernay, 2012 Wine Person of the Year serves up the Syrah of your dreams (and his Condrieu). Hints of white pepper, slightly smoky with plenty of ripe dark berry perfume. The results: light, juicy and elegant, soft tannin, and lovely acidity.

**Petroni Rosso di Sonoma £41 (bottle)**

Sonoma Valley, USA: 2007: Syrah 75% Sangiovese 20% Cabernet Sauvignon 5%: 14% volume

The ripe flavors are balanced nicely with tangy acidity and subdued tannins to keep this wine dense, fresh and easy to drink.

**Barbera d'Alba Paiagal £46 (bottle)**

Piedmont, Italy: 2010: 100% Barbera: 14% vol

Purple-red in colour with sweet fruits on the nose, this fairly structured wine has good acidity and fine tannin making it deliciously fresh and easy drinking.

### CHAMPAGNE

**Billecart-Salmon Brut Rosé Non Vintage £80 (bottle)**

Champagne, France: Blend of Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier: 12% vol

As good as Rosé Champagne gets. Front 9 – fresh ripe raspberries and citrus. Back 9 – Smooth and mouth coating with silky summer fruits and white peach. Full 18 – Quite simply stunning.

**Billecart-Salmon Vintage 2004 Extra-Brut £100 (bottle)**

Champagne, France: 70% Pinot Noir 30% Chardonnay: 12% vol

Front 9 – crisp, fresh fruits of melon and a touch of brioche & honey. Back 9 – soft, yeasty and mineral. Full 18 – A fresh take on Vintage Champagne with plenty of richness and body.
